Neutering Campaigns

While puppies such as these recently rescued by our team are undeniably gorgeous, we would rather their births had been prevented. That's why neutering stray and abandoned animals remains at the heart of our mission and why we are proud to announce that we recently took part in the TAC Social Annual Neuter Campaign at Pata Rât, Romania's largest landfill site. This area is 'home' to countless unneutered dogs and approximately 1,500 Roma people living in unimaginable conditions. The untreated waste at Pata Rât brings severe pollution risks, putting the dedicated vets and assistants who operate the campaign in constant danger. These heroes face not only the physical threats of toxins seeping into the soil and groundwater but also the pain of witnessing both animals and humans struggling in such deplorable conditions.

This campaign is a beacon of hope, making a profound difference in controlling the dog population and striving to create a safer, healthier environment for the entire community at Pata Rât.

Additionally, thirty-six animals were spayed with the help of our friends at the monastery, making a world of difference. Our neuter campaigns in these monasteries are incredibly important. Thanks to your compassion and donations, the forests around will no longer be overrun with kittens and puppies. Your care is truly making a difference.










Combatting the Spread of Canine Brucellosis

Amid recent press coverage surrounding canine brucellosis in rescued dogs from Romania, we have heard growing concerns and we fully understand why people may be feeling apprehensive.

At Paws2Rescue, we pride ourselves on being a responsible rescue organisation. As loving pet owners ourselves, we take these fears seriously and are committed to ensuring the health and well-being of every dog we rescue and rehome. To address these concerns and promote responsible interventions, Paws2Rescue initiated and funded a crucial study in collaboration with Romanian veterinary professionals and researchers. Our pilot study, conducted with the Spiru Haret Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and the Estonian University of Life Sciences, tested 100 rescued dogs. The results revealed that 8% were positive for Brucella canis, a devastating disease that spreads through contact with infected bodily fluids, emphasising the need for ongoing testing and awareness.

Currently, we are testing 300 further dogs, aligning our protocols with international standards and mapping potential hotspots. We are also creating educational materials to inform veterinary professionals and the public about the importance of accurate testing and responsible management. We presented our findings at the 9th International Conference on Emerging Zoonoses in June 2024 and will again at the World One Health Congress in September 2024. Additionally, we will host local workshops and training events in Romania covering prevention and diagnosis.

However, our efforts extend beyond Romania. We aim to educate and raise awareness about responsible management of positive cases to prevent the spread of canine brucellosis in the UK. To understand why dog owners may hesitate to test for canine brucellosis, we are launching a survey. Your participation will help us improve public policies and support humane management practices.





Paws2Rescue is dedicated to advocating for science-backed interventions that protect animal welfare. We support proactive screening, spaying, neutering and isolating positive cases to prevent the spread of brucellosis. Since the end of 2023, we have been sending blood samples of adopted dogs to the cutting- edge APHA laboratory in the UK for testing before they leave Romania. Therefore, we urge everyone to look beyond the negative press and remember that these animals deserve our compassion and help, not vilification. Together, we can limit the transmission of canine brucellosis and continue improving animal welfare in Romania.



Lending a Helping Paw in Ukraine and Egypt










